## PA Magazine Publisher Slated to Speak Eagle Grange – Tuesday, April 6, 2021 @ 6:30 p.m.



Mr. Al Holliday of Camp Hill (left), founder and publisher of *Pennsylvania Magazine*, will share highlights and overviews of some of the most interesting, odd and perplexing people of our state since its founding. *Pennsylvania Magazine* is the only periodical that covers the whole state with feature articles and photos. Every attendee will receive a free copy of the magazine and a guide sheet to the presentation.

Al started the publication in 1981 with his wife as a guide to the history, regional attractions and stories about interesting Pennsylvanians and their accomplishments, past and present. He is a native of upstate New York and has BA and MA degrees from Michigan State University. He came to Pennsylvania to work in the Department of Education where he was director of public relations prior to founding the magazine.

- *why purchasing the Erie Triangle made our colony unique*
- *the unusual honor that William and Hannah Penn received from federal government in 1983*
- *the odds that the composer of God Bless America was a Pennsylvanian*
- *the reasons the Pennsylvania Turnpike was constructed*
- *the good possibility that the real inventor of the telephone was a resident of Camp Hill*
- *even which of the Three Stooges was a native of Pennsylvania*

A brief business session will be held prior to the program and will include the draping of the Grange charter in memory of the late William McElroy. Social distancing protocols will be observed and wearing of face masks required. Disposable plastic gloves will be provided for serving of refreshments.
