Connecting the Dots . . . A Personal Journey

Frequently we fail to recognize the long-term and positive influence of youth programs like FFA, 4-H, Scouts and Grange. Our speaker on February 1, 2022, will share the fascinating story how 4-H changed her life and set her on course for a career in agricultural and economic development around the world.



Nancy Walker (left) was born and raised in an active Grange family in rural Perry County where she was a 4-H member for 10 years and a 4-H leader for 25 years. She holds advanced degrees from Kutztown University, The School for International Training, and Penn State University. An early experience through IFYE (International 4-H Youth Exchange) to India led to her life's work that took her across the globe.

Her first "grown-up" job was as an art teacher in a Newfoundland, Canada outpost village. Later she served as a US Peace Corps Volunteer to the Philippines and managed a rural development project in Uganda, Africa. Nancy worked in eight different countries in East and West Africa, Southeast Asia, Central Asia and Russia with Agricultural Cooperative Development International and Connecting New Frontiers in Agriculture.

Through all her travels, she remained connected to the Grange and now has 50+ years of membership and is currently a member of Oliver Grange #1069 and president of the Perry County Pomona #69. Since returning to the family homestead, she enjoys her cat family, gardening, reading, painting, practicing Tai Chi, kayaking and rustic camping.

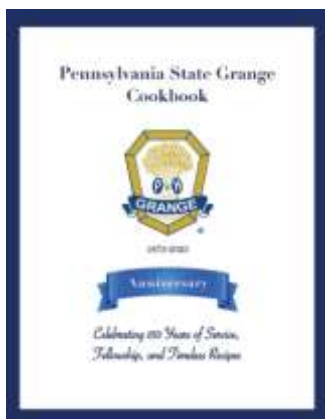

Lots of Great Ideas from 1/4/2022 Planning Meeting

A “Vote with Your Feet” activity began the meeting with a series of questions which members answered by walking to different parts of the hall to indicate one of three possible responses to each question: “**Agree**”, “**Disagree**”, or “**No Opinion**”.

Among the comments shared during this discussion:

- *Enjoy fellowship, refreshments, improving the community*
- *Other commitments make it difficult to decide what to attend.*
- *Wish more younger people would be involved.*
- *Hope for more involvement **IN** the community (collective volunteering rather than just giving money)*
- *Compared to where we were 2 years ago, we are doing pretty well.*
- *Like the fundraisers we do; like working together.*
- *Like less structured meetings where business can still happen, but not as formal; special outings/events attract new people*
- *Continue to make the building more attractive for rentals*
- *We don't want to get stuck in a rut.*
- *People want more activities than formal meetings; people are not interested in the ceremony*
- *Continue to offer high-quality programs.*
- *Suggestion to hold 2-3 special events to invite others.*

Doug then led a planning discussion to brainstorm projects, property improvements, fund raising, and other events/activities for 2022.

Community Service Projects

Some projects have already been approved and have been planned, including:

- Second “Share the Love” dinner – February 12
- FFA Blue Jacket scholarships for Milton and Montgomery schools – February 1

Discussion about other proposed projects included:

- **Family Fun Fair** – perhaps combined with pavilion dedication in fall 2022 with benefit dinner for local fire companies. Suggestion: Ask the Lions Club in Montgomery to support the project.

- **Paint ‘n Sip** – perhaps for a local cause. Suggestion: Ask local art teachers to be the instructor.
- **Free Community Picnic.** Suggestions:
 - Book community entertainment
 - Hold a joint picnic activity with other Granges
 - Consider holding the picnic at Clinton Twp. Park, where we recently donated money
- **Meet the Candidates Night** – September/October

Property Improvements

Some projects have already been approved and are in progress, including:

- Eagle Scout pavilion project – in progress
- FFA tree planting/bird houses – approved
- Permanent sign installation/lighting – in progress. David Troutman will follow up on this project.

Discussion about other projects included:

- Sink/faucet replacement – a donation was received to underwrite this cost.
- Chair and table racks – consensus agreed that this was a good idea. Check Uline.
- Long-term goals?
 - Exterior Siding – possible conflict with seeking historical funding; agreement that insulation would be good.
 - Paved Parking – would make winter maintenance easier. Discussion also included how to improve traffic flow for take-out dinners. Consensus was that the priority would be paving.
