

Pennsylvania State Grange Foundation Scholarship


\$500 per academic year (may be renewed in subsequent years) Up to four scholarships awarded per year

Established in 1996 by state delegate action, this scholarship is available to students entering their junior or senior year in college, and financial need must be demonstrated.

Santee Student Loans Five \$2,000 interest free loans awarded per year

Ellis M. Santee, an active Grange member and rural doctor, established this loan fund to help Grange members obtain an education.

Grange members or their children may apply for one of five loans, as long as they are a full-time student at any institution accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE).

The Grange Scholarship Endowment at Penn State University

\$1,500 per academic year (may be renewed in subsequent years)

This scholarship is to recognize the outstanding work of an undergraduate student enrolled in at least their sophomore year at any campus of Pennsylvania State university who also Demonstrates financial need.

Selected by the Penn State office of Student Aid Scholarship Committee from nominees named by the PA State Grange Scholarship Committee.



Rhone Grant

*one grant awarded per year

Grant given in honour of Leonard Rhone, the third Master of the PA State Grange

Applicants must be pursuing a degree in agriculture or human development & family services at Penn State University and secure a recommendation from both the Master of their Subordinate and Pomona Granges.



Deaf Interpretor Scholarship

\$250 *one grant awarded per year

Applicants must be a Grange member in good standing and be enrolled in a credible program leading to certification as an interpreter for the deaf.
